Letter from Mayor Tyler Payne

Hello, Paradise Islanders!

Wishing you and your family a happy holiday season. As the weather starts to cool off, I hope to meet more of you out and about on the island and at our signature event, Sanding Ovations in November!

We have a lot going on in Treasure Island, so please be patient with us as we work to improve the community. We sustained some damage from Hurricane Idalia that we are still working to address. On Paradise Island, it was mainly damage to our landscaping. You'll notice a lot of dead grass and some dying palms and shrubbery. We are gradually working to address those issues. I know many of our residents are dealing with this as well, so it will be a process to get our neighborhood back to its green and beautiful state.

We are working closely with Duke Energy and the other utility vendors to reduce the number of utility poles on Paradise Blvd by co-locating the lines. Duke has been responsive to our concerns and by the time this newsletter goes out, they will have hopefully replaced some of the wooden poles with concrete poles and removed the shorter poles.

We are nearing completion on City Hall. We had issues with the roof leaking, which has now been fixed. The only thing left that we are waiting on are some punch list items on the interior and some window leaks to be addressed by our contractors.

Downtown, Pirate Square is in the process of being demolished. I have been in touch with the owner and discussed their plans for the future. In the short/medium term, they are planning a public paid parking lot. In the long term, they are still planning on a mixed use development with retail, restaurants, residential, and hotel rooms. in Treasure Island is limited to the five floors above the first floor of parking and/or retail.

The old McDonalds property has an approved site plan for retail on the ground floor and a parking garage above, but we have recently found out that the project is on hold. The owners also own Surf Style and Thunderbird. So, they are still focusing their efforts on hurricane recovery for their Surf Style locations impacted last year by Hurricane Ian.

The Rally/Shell gas station was recently approved by the City Commission to construct a new building and add more pumps (including diesel).

The City recently launched a new page on our website (under "Departments" -> "Community Improvement" -> "City Zoning & Future Land Use Maps" -> "Downtown Treasure Island Development Map/Plans Submitted") with an interactive map of the Downtown area that shows projects and their current status with the City so that you can have 100 percent accurate information.

If you ever have any questions about what is going on in the City, please do not hesitate to reach out to me. I'm always willing to get you the information straight from the horse's mouth. Don't rely on rumors you hear on NextDoor or Facebook.

Letter from the Police Chief

The holiday season is approaching, and I just wanted to share a few general reminders to make sure you are safe and secure.

No matter what method you use to shop, in person or online, there are several ways to make your experience more secure.

- When shopping in person, always be aware of your surroundings, do not get caught up in the moment and forget to lock your car, or leave your wallet or purse somewhere.
- Never leave gifts or packages visible in your car, put them in your trunk or out of sight.
- If shopping online, make sure whatever device you use is secure and your passwords are solid. Only shop through trusted sources, if a deal is much too good to be true, it is, and it may take you to a scammer's website.
- Always be careful about what personal information you are sharing; personal information like your date of birth or Social Security number is not required to make an average online purchase.

In Treasure Island, we love pirates, but not "Porch Pirates." If you know you have a package coming and will not be home to retrieve it, see if you can have a friend or neighbor get it for you, or have it delivered to a secure location. Most delivery services have an app for your phone that will tell you when a package has been delivered so you will know.

As always, do not hesitate to call us if you see suspicious activity in your neighborhood, that is why we are here. We at TIPD wish all of you a safe and happy holiday season!

Hurricane Idalia definitely left its calling card on Treasure Island. Unfortunately, some parts of Paradise Island sustained high water damage in a number of areas and many of our public spots. It included our gazebo bushes, trees in our park and adjoining grassy areas. Our public works department did a good job getting out to as many areas as possible. They raked, removed damaged bushes and trees, cleaned up trash, and began replacing and planting in the damaged areas. More plantings will be coming as supplies become available.

Also, I met with the construction manager for Frontier Communications on communication well plastic lids damaged and loss from the storm. He assured me that they have manufactured heavier lids to replace the plastic ones and plans to exchange them over the next few months to eliminate this issue when high water events occur.
