Letter from Mayor Tyler Payne

Greetings Treasure Islanders!

It has been a busy end of the year, and we are going through many changes at City Hall. Our City Manager, Amy Davis, is leaving the City for an opportunity at the County as an Assistant to the County Administrator. Amy has been a fantastic leader for our City employees and she has accomplished great progress for our City during her tenure as City Manager. We should all be grateful for her contributions to our community. Retired City Manager Garry Brumback will be filling in as Interim City Manager while we conduct a comprehensive search for a new City Manager. We also have an election underway for the City Commission seat in Sunset Beach (District 4) that will be taking place in March. We had a vacancy for the District 3 (Paradise Island) Commission Seat that we recently appointed former Mayor and Commissioner Bob Minning to fill until March 2025 when the seat will be up for election. As of December 11, nobody filed to run against me for reelection, so I was reelected without opposition. It is my honor to continue serving you as Mayor for another 3 years.

We are nearing completion on the new City Hall facility. There are outstanding issues with the elevator equipment and the windows that will be addressed in the next couple of months. We should be able to get a Temporary Certificate of Occupancy once the elevator issue is fixed and then we can move in while the windows are being addressed. Thank you all for your patience on this project! Once we getting moved out of the old City Hall, it will be demolished to make way for our new Master Lift Station and Public Works facility. This will be a big upgrade to our critical infrastructure and a huge improvement to our sewer system resiliency.

Our beaches have taken a beating this winter. Please be assured that it is at the top of my priority list to keep the pressure on the County and the Army Corps of Engineers to come

up with a long-term solution for our beach renourishment. Our City Staff is actively working with the County team in charge of the project. There are many moving pieces that are being monitored carefully.

The Club at Treasure Island was recently purchased by a private equity firm out of California. I have been in contact with the new owners, and they have told us that they plan to resume operations in the near future with new partners to operate the various functions of the property. From what I'm told, this would include an outsourced restaurant from a local hospitality/restaurant group on the 2nd floor. Please stay tuned for more details!

We are continuing the roll out of our Smoking and Vaping Ban on the beaches and parks with new signage to inform visitors. This will continue to be a learning process for the public, so please do your part to spread the word that our beaches are now smoke-free. We have pamphlets available at City Hall that provide highlights of the ban.

The Commission recently reviewed several studies regarding traffic, mobility, safety, and connectivity. Please be sure to check out the City website for more information and share your thoughts and feedback with me and your Commissioner.

The City Projects page on the City website is always a great place to check in for the most up-to-date information on big projects going on in the city.

MORE BEAUTY IN PARADISE

The City of Treasure Island has identified three landscaping initiatives tagged for Paradise Island. The projects include Paradise Blvd., Treasure Lane and Paradise Lane. Duke Energy has requested the palms located along Paradise Blvd. be removed due to interference with the power lines. On Tuesday, January 22 residents were invited to meet with the City Public Works Department and landscaping design consultants on landscaping suggestions. Samples displayed were all salt tolerant. Once residents have the opportunity to pick what they would like to see, the city will tabulate the results and have a follow-up meeting in the near future to review and discuss.

The next scheduled meeting is a very critical one in order

to lay out the upcoming plans and options we should consider. As we move forward with the plan and identify plantings. Those same choices will be considered for both Treasure and Paradise Lanes. Both lanes will be getting some long overdue landscaping upgrades.

Please make every effort possible to attend the upcoming meetings once scheduled. This will be our opportunity to understand and consider next steps and options available that we are in favor of or against.
